<u>From Fr David:</u> I have spoken to the Vicar General, and we are now in a position to look at our Sunday Mass provision. As I have said before, the aim is to establish a pattern that I can manage when I am on my own. The proposed pattern also shares out the disruption equally between the three parishes and seems to me to be the fairest model I can come up with. Therefore, starting on <u>SATURDAY 7th MAY</u> we will run the following pattern.

- 1. The Mass at St Mary's Osbaldeston will move to Saturday at 4pm.
- 2. The Vigil Mass for English Martyrs, Whalley and St Mary's Langho will move to 5.30pm and will alternate between the two churches, so that each church will have a Vigil Mass once a fortnight. (The Vigil Mass on the 7th May will be at English Martyrs.)
- 3. The Sunday Mass at St Mary's, Langho will move to 9.15am
- 4. The Sunday Mass at English Martyrs, Whalley will move to 11.15am.
- 5. Baptisms at all three churches, whether on a Saturday or a Sunday, will move to 1pm. (For any Baptisms already booked, these can stay at 12.30pm if that is more convenient.)
- 6. Weekday Masses will be evenly spread out between the three churches and will be supplemented by Eucharistic Services where appropriate. Please see the newsletter each week for details.
- 7. Confessions will be as advertised in the newsletter.
- 8. Weddings and Funerals will be advertised as they occur.

I am aware that this will mean changing well established routines. Unfortunately, we are living in a time where there are very few priests. In the past there were six priests spread between our three parishes, now there is just me.I am not making these changes lightly. We will trial this new pattern for the next few months and review it towards the end of the year. I will welcome any constructive comment and feedback.
